Juan Senor is a leading business presenter and an established independent producer and director. Until recently he was senior London correspondent for International Herald Tribune Television.

As a presenter for CNBC, he anchored Europe Today and Market Watch. Prior to that he reported on foreign affairs for The MacNeil-Lehrer NewsHour, for American PBS. His exclusive interviews with the late Yasser Arafat and Yitzhak Rabin received an EMMY nomination.

As a programme maker, Juan has produced business and factual profiles in more than 52 countries, on every continent.

In 2004 Juan skied to the North Pole to raise money for charity. The following year he trekked across the western Sahara for 20 days in aid of the fund named after his daughter Mary Rose, who has Down's Syndrome. In 2006 Juan leads the first international expedition of disabled athletes to ski to the South Pole.

A Spanish national educated in Europe and the US, Juan completed his university degrees in New York. He is conversant in six languages.
