Tony Davis was appointed to his current position in January 2005. An aviation professional with over 20 years experience in both full service and low cost airlines, Mr Davis has led the development of Tiger Airways as one of Asia's leading low fare airlines.

Since Mr Davis' appointment as President and Chief Executive Officer, Tiger Airways has grown its network from just 3 destinations to 16 destinations in 7 countries, was the launch customer of Singapore's Budget Terminal and has carried more than 2 million passengers. The airline's achievements and innovation have been recognized by the Centre for Asia Pacific Aviation's "Best Low Cost Airline" Award in 2006.

Prior to joining Tiger Airways, Tony was the founding Managing Director of bmibaby, the successful British low fares carrier, where he led the development of the airline in the very competitive Western European market from business plan to a fleet of 14 aircraft serving 26 destinations in the UK, Ireland and continental Europe.

Besides the low fares airline sector, Tony has broad experience in designing and leading international airline strategies, airline operations, corporate affairs, marketing and revenue management, and in representing airlines before government and regulatory agencies, in the UK, the United States and other major countries.

Prior to the launch of bmibaby, Tony worked at British Midland Airways from 1999 through 2001 as Director of Corporate Affairs, and from 1997 through 1999 as General Manager, Industry Affairs and Pricing.

Before that, Mr Davis worked in the Middle East at Gulf Air in Bahrain and for the first nine years of his career he worked at British Airways in various management capacities in marketing and strategic alliances, stationed in London and New York.

Mr Davis holds a Postgraduate Diploma in Business Administration from Lancaster University, is a Fellow of the Society for Encouragement of Arts, Manufacturing and Communications and a Member of the Royal Aeronautical Society. He is 41 years old.
